The SECOND BOOK.

Of the First Motion.

IN the preceding Book, we have laid down the Principles of a True and Physical Astronomy; that is, we have explained, in general, the motions of the Stars, as are really in nature: But some notice must be taken of the Appearance of them; that is, the Elements of an Astronomy fitted to them, are to be formed. For as it is out of all doubt to any Philosopher that considers the Reasons of Things, that the Earth is carried about among the Planets, so 'tis likewise certain to every one that enjoys his Sight, that the Earth appears at rest, in the
